### TULIPS

**Darwin Hybrid Mix** M 32/\$18  
A wonderful mix of vibrant colors, with strong 20"-24" stems and large blooms. Great repeat the following year.

**Tulip Species Mix** E 15/\$9  
A blend of small species varieties, these are true perennials and naturalize; great for rock gardens, 6"-8".

**Tulip 'Single Late Mix'** L 15/\$15  
These are the tallest tulips at 24"-28", blooming in late spring after other varieties are finished. Larger blooms as well.

**Tulip 'Angelique'** L 15/\$15  
Double flowered variety with pink peony shaped blooms, flowering in late spring, 16" tall.

**Tulip 'Elegant Lady'** M 10/\$9  
Lily flowered tulip, with pointed petals – 22" tall, ivory colored blending to pink at the edges.

**Tulip 'Red Riding Hood'** M 10/\$9  
Gregii tulip, 10"-12" tall, bright red flowers, leaves streaked with burgundy, nice in rock gardens.

**Tulip 'Purple Prince'** E/M 10/\$9  
Single early type, 14" tall, rich purple flowers on strong stems.

**Tulip 'Oxfords Elite'** M 10/\$9  
Darwin tulip, 22" tall, red blended with orange and yellow, very eye catching.

**Tulip 'Hemisphere'** M 10/\$10  
Triumph tulip 18" tall; flowers begin white, develop flecks and stripes, mature to deep rose.

**Tulip 'Happy Generation'** M 10/\$10  
Triumph tulip 18" tall, white with striking bright red flares.

### NARCISSUS

**Narcissus Dutch Master** M 28/\$18  
Classic, large solid yellow 18" flowers; long trumpet with serrated edges, mid spring. Extra-large bag for landscaping.

**Narcissus Season of Sunshine** 20/\$18  
Blend of yellow flowered varieties, blooming over an extended season.

**Narcissus Pink Mix** (height/season varies) 20/\$18  
Collection of all pink types, these will have the best color in filtered sunlight.

**Narcissus 'Double Mix'** (height/season varies) 15/\$15  
Mix of all double flowered varieties.

**Narcissus 'Bell Song'** M/L 10/\$10  
White petals with a pink cup, 14", filtered sunlight best to develop pink coloring.

**Narcissus 'February Gold'** E 10/\$9  
Swept back yellow petals, deeper yellow cup, 14" tall, early.

**Narcissus 'Mount. Hood'** M 15/\$15  
Large pure white flowers up to 4" on tall 16"-20" stems.

**Narcissus 'New Baby'** L 10/\$10  
Late flowering miniature variety 4"-8" tall, multiple flowers per stem, two tone yellow.

**Narcissus 'Sailboat'** M 10/\$10  
White with pale yellow cup, 10"-12", multiple flowers per stem.

**Narcissus 'Skype'** M 8/\$10  
White flowers, bright pink cup, 18"-20", filtered sunlight.

## SPECIALTY BULBS

**Allium ‘Giganteum’** L 3/\$17  
Softball size 5”-6” purple flowers on 3’ stems, full sun, blooms early summer.

**Camass Lily (Camassia)** M 15/\$10  
Lovely native bulb, spikes of blue flowers 12”-15”, was a staple food source for Native Americans.

**Crocus Large Flowering Mix** E 40/\$15  
A mix of colors, including purples, yellows, whites and bicolors. Sun or part shade, 6”, blooms March/April.

**Glory of the Snow (Chionodoxa)** E 15/\$9  
One of the earliest to bloom, starchy white flowers, 5”-10” tall, naturalizes well.

**Grape Hyacinth (Muscari)** M 15/\$9  
Purplish blue flowers in little grape like clusters, lovely in large drifts, naturalizes well.

**Grecian Windflower (Anemone blanda)** L 12/\$9  
Blend of whites, pinks and blues; daisy like flowers, 4”-6” tall

**Hyacinth Pastel Mix** E/M 9/\$15  
Mix of lighter colors, 8”-12” tall, very fragrant, easy to force.

**Oriental Lily Mix** L 4/\$15  
Tall plants with large flowers, mix of colors in whites, pinks and reds, 3’-4’ tall.

**Star of Bethlehem ‘Sochii’** L 3/\$9  
Uncommon variety, white flower spikes late spring to early summer, long bloom season, nice cut flower.

**Peony ‘Sarah Bernhardt’** L \$13  
Huge double pink flowers on 30’ tall bushy plants, bloom early summer, very long lived. Bare root division.

**Bulb Food** 3.5 lbs/\$11  
Formulated especially for bulbs to promote vigorous root growth, 10-12-10.

## PERENNIALS

S = Sun

PS = Part Shade

Sh = Shade

N = Native

**Featured Selection: Hydrangea arborescens ‘Haas Halo’ N/S/PS gallon/\$10**

‘Haas Halo’ is a selection of native Smooth Hydrangea, with blue green foliage and large white lacecap flower heads reaching 12” across. It will mature at 5’ x 5’ and does not suffer winter dieback as the macrophylla types do. Flowers remain upright in heavy rain unlike the globe flowered varieties.

**Arkansas Bluestar (Amsonia hubrichtii)** \$5  
Native wildflower, starchy pale blue flower clusters on 3’ stems, thread like foliage, great yellow fall color. N/S/PS

**American Feverfew (Parthenium integrifolium)** \$5  
Native for full sun, woolly white flowers on 3’-4’ plants, toothed foliage; flowers late spring/early summer. N/S

**Anemone ‘Annabelle White’ (Anemone multifida)** \$5  
June blooming native, forms a neat clump of foliage 1’ tall, single white blooms. Nice in rock gardens. N/S/PS

**Aster ‘October Skies’ (A. oblongifolius)** \$5  
Native aster to 2’, blooms Sept-Oct with numerous 1” lilac to light blue flowers. N/S

**Butterfly Weed ‘Hello Yellow’ (A. tuberosa)** \$5  
Native wildflower 2’ tall, full sun, with yellow flowers instead of the typical orange; host for monarch butterflies. Do not transplant once established. Blooms midsummer. N/S

**Culvers Root (Veronicastrum sibiricum)** \$5  
Tall perennial for full sun, 3’-5’, blooms July-Sept with spikes of light purple flowers. S

**Ozark Coneflower (Echinacea paradoxa)** \$5  
Yellow flowering variety 2’-3’ tall, blooms June-Sept; attracts goldfinches if seed heads left in place. N/S

**Ornamental Strawberry ‘Lipstick’ (Fragaria)** \$5  
Low growing spreader 6”-12” with pink flowers; will produce some small edible fruits, but deadhead for more blooms. S/PS

**Potentilla ‘Ron McBeath’ (P. nepalensis)** \$5  
Deep rose flowers on clump forming 12” plants; very long bloom season spring through summer. S/PS

**Sweet Coneflower (Rudbeckia subtomentosa)** \$5  
Tough native wildflower 4’-6’, full sun, many yellow flowers that attract bees, birds and butterflies, blooms Aug-Oct. N/S

**Smooth Ironweed (Vernonia fasciculata)** \$5  
Native wildflower 2’-4’ tall, spikes of purple flowers, prefers average to wet soils, attracts butterflies, blooms July-Sept. N/S

**Veronica ‘Bergens Blue’ (Veronica x)** \$5  
Groundcover variety, many blue flowers in loose clusters on spreading plants 6” tall; blooms early summer, then sporadically throughout the season. S

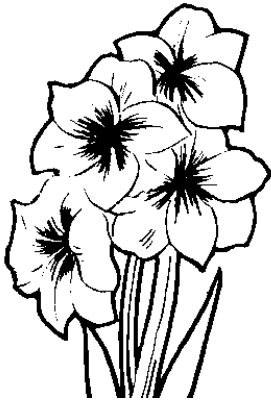
