Blend of varieties and colors for long term establishment in the garden.			White petals with yellow orange cup edged with coral, 14"-16".

SPECIALTY BULBS

Allium azureum L 15/\$9
Starry cornflower blue flowers on 24" stems, flowers in June, loved by bees and butterflies.

Allium 'Gladiator' L \$9
Huge 6" globes of rosy purple flowers 36"-48" tall, loved by bees and butterflies.

Crocus Large Flowering Mix E 20/\$9
A mix of colors, including purples, yellows, whites and bicolors. Sun or part shade, 6", blooms March/April.

Dwarf Iris (I. reticulata) E 15/\$9
Early blooming miniature iris, purple blue flowers, 4" tall.

Grecian Windflower (Anemone) L 12/\$9
Blend of whites, pinks and blues; daisy like flowers, 4"-6" tall.

Hyacinth Mix E/M 9/\$14
Mixed colors, 8"-12" tall, very fragrant, easy to force.

Lily 'Casa Blanca' August 3/\$10
Oriental lily with large pure white flowers, sweet fragrance, will reach 4' tall, sun or light shade.

Muscari (Grape Hyacinth) E/M 15/\$9
Early midseason bloomer, 6"-8", with cobalt blue flower clusters.

Spanish Bluebells L 15/\$11
(*Scilla campanulata*) Dangling bell shaped flowers in blue, pink and white, 12"-15" tall, grows in sun or shade. Great naturalizer.

Winter Aconite (Eranthis) E 15/\$10
Very early bloomer, 3"-6", with cheerful yellow flowers that pop through the snow beginning in March.

Bulb Food 3.5 lbs/\$11
Formulated especially for bulbs to promote vigorous root growth, 10-12-10.

Featured Selection: Saskatoon Serviceberry 'Regent' N/S/PS 2 quart pot \$11

'Regent' is a compact selection of native serviceberry (*Amelanchier alnifolia*) reaching 4'-6'. This shrub produces white flowers in early spring followed by berries that resemble blueberries in size, color and taste, and can be eaten fresh or cooked into jams, jellies and pies. Yellow fall foliage; birds and other wildlife love the berries as well.

Aster October Skies (Aster oblongifolius) N/S \$5
Prolific lavender blue flowers on 1.5'-2' mounds, blooms August to October.

Butterfly Weed (Asclepias tuberosa) N/S \$5
Native wildflower full sun, bright orange flowers, to 2'. Prefers dry, well drained soils once established, attracts butterflies.

Canada Beachhead Iris (Iris setosa canadensis) N/S/PS \$5
Lovely native dwarf iris with blue-purple flowers, 12"-18" tall, sun or light shade, moist soil.

Coneflower 'Green Twister' (E. purpurea) N/S/PS \$5
Naturally occurring variant of purple coneflower, flowers are magenta with lime green tips; 2'-3', great for pollinators and birds.

Coreopsis 'Route 66' (C. verticillata) N/S \$5
Cultivar of native threadleaf coreopsis, 2'-3', yellow daisy flowers with red centers, attracts butterflies, full sun only.

Dumbo's Ears (Rudbeckia maxima) N/S \$5
Large 3" yellow daisy flowers on 5'-7' stems, over a clump of round blue green leaves, sun.

Hibiscus 'Pink Clouds' (Hibiscus moscheutos) N/S \$5
Tall native perennial 4'-5' with huge intense pink flowers late summer. Likes sun and moisture, very hardy.

Indian Grass (Sorghastrum nutans) N/S \$5
Lovely native ornamental grass 3'-5', blue green foliage, upright form, yellow plume like seed heads.

Joe Pye Weed 'Little Joe' (Eupatorium) N/S/PS \$5
Compact variety of native Joe Pye Weed, 4' tall, clusters of pink-purple flowers in summer. Pollinator magnet.

Scottish Bluebells (Campanula rotundifolia) N/S/PS \$5
Small native wildflower 6"-12" with nodding bell shaped sky blue flowers all summer, sun or part shade.

Sword Leaf Phlox (Phlox buckleyi) N/S/PS \$5
Native phlox growing in loose mounds to 12", sun or part shade, clusters of pink flowers, attracts butterflies.

White False Indigo (Baptisia lactea) N/S/PS \$5
Bushy perennial 3'-5', smoky purple stems with elegant white flower spikes, attracts pollinators. Do not move once established.
