## SPECIALTY BULBS

**Allium giganteum** L 3/\$18  
Tall stems 3'-5' topped with spheres of purple flower cluster up to 6" in diameter.

**Crocus Large Flowering Mix** E 20/\$9  
A mix of colors, including purples, yellows, whites and bicolors. Sun or part shade, 6", blooms March/April.

**Dwarf Iris (I. reticulata)** E 15/\$9  
Early blooming miniature iris, purple blue flowers, 4" tall.

**Hyacinth Mix** E/M 9/\$14  
Mixed colors, 8"-12" tall, very fragrant, easy to force.

**Lily 'Rosella's Dream'** Midsummer 3/\$7  
Asiatic Lily, 3'-4' tall, white flowers blended with pale pink.

**Muscari Mix(Grape Hyacinth)** E/M 45/\$12  
Early midseason bloomer, 6"-8", with cobalt blue flower clusters.

**Peony 'Bowl of Beauty'** L \$10  
Deep rose pink petals with cluster of bright yellow stamens in the center, 3' tall. Bare root.

**Snowdrops 'Flore Pleno'** E 5/\$10  
Double flowered form with nodding white flowers, very early bloom, 5"-8", great naturalizer.

**Star of Bethlehem 'Sochi'** L 3/\$10  
Starry white flowers on 2' stems, blooms in June.

**Trout Lily 'Pagoda' (Erythronium x)** E/M 3/\$10  
Lily like yellow flowers over attractive basal foliage, 12"-14", lovely in a woodland garden, part shade. **PLANT IMMEDIATELY.**

**Bulb Food** 3 lbs/\$11  
Formulated especially for bulbs to promote vigorous root growth, 10-12-10.

## PERENNIALS

**Featured Selection: Summersweet 'Hummingbird' (*Clethra alnifolia*) N/S/PS quart \$11**

'Hummingbird' is compact variety of summersweet, a native shrub favoring part shade and moist soils. It typically grows 3'-4' tall, and bears spikes of fragrant white flowers in July/August. Summersweet attracts a wide variety of butterflies and bees, and will grow in any soil from moist to wet, even in swamp areas.

(All plants below are in 2.5" pots)

**Anemone 'Annabella White' (A. multifida)** N/S/PS  
White flowers and attractive lacy foliage in late spring, 10"-12".

**Aromatic Aster (A. oblongifolius)** N/S  
Native wildflower 2' tall, violet blue daisies with yellow centers late summer/fall, attracts butterflies.  
\$5

**Carolina Lupine (Thermopsis villosa)** N/S  
Large clumping perennial 3'-4', spikes of lupine like yellow flowers.  
\$5

**Coneflower 'Ruby Star' (E. purpurea)** N/S/PS  
Variety of native purple coneflower with reddish violet 4" flowers on a 2'-3' plant, great for butterflies, June-August.  
\$5

**Dianthus 'Itsaul White' (D. plumarius)** S  
Carnation type double white flowers, attractive gray green foliage. Spreads slowly to about 18" wide; 12"-18" tall.  
\$5

**Evening Primrose 'Silver Blade' (Oenothera)** N/S  
Low growing native, large yellow flowers, silvery green foliage, 6" tall, good drainage, dry soil when established.  
\$5

**False Sunflower 'Burning Hearts' (Heliopsis)** N/S  
Large native, yellow daisies with burnt orange centers, very dark foliage, to 4' tall, great for butterflies.  
\$5

**Joe Pye Weed (Eupatorium purpureum)** N/S/PS  
Tall 5'-7' native with mauve pink flowers, likes moist soil, excellent for butterflies, blooms summer to fall.  
\$5

**New Jersey Tea (Ceanothus americanus)** N/S/PS  
Small native shrub 3'-4', cluster of small fragrant white flowers, great pollinator plant, blooms late spring to summer.  
\$5

**Penstemon 'Prairie Splendor' (Penstemon x)** N/S  
Hybrid of native penstemons, extra large flowers on 2' stems, white, pink, rose or purple. Prefers well drained dryer soils.  
\$5

**Phlox 'Forever Pink' (Phlox x)** N/S  
'Forever Pink' is a compact 16" pink flowering phlox; flowers earlier than garden phlox, mildew free, very floriferous.

**Prairie Blazing Star (Liatris pycnostacha)** N/S  
Native wildflower with spikes of rosy purple fluffy flowers in mid summer, can reach 2'-4', great for bees, butterflies.
